## **Focus of the Symposium 9<sup>th</sup> ICESKS - Information, Communication and Economic Sciences in the Knowledge Society**

### **Symposium's purpose**

The aim of the Symposium is to bring together experts in Information, Communication and Economic Sciences with a different background to discuss the current developments in the Knowledge Society. The changing landscape involves quite complex issues not so easy to grasp by an individual expert. Symposium is an annual international conference which provides an international forum for researchers and professionals to share their knowledge and to report new advances on all topics related to knowledge systems and advanced information systems, also. The conference program focuses on knowledge systems and advanced information systems, including their theoretical foundations, infrastructure, enabling technologies and emerging applications. Furthermore, the aim is not to go into details of technical issues, but to discuss the complexity at level that is understandable to non-experts and enables the discussion of Knowledge Society complexities to the mutual benefit of all participants. Papers accepted by two independent reviewers will be published in the Conference Proceedings. The conference intends to attract professionals, students and academics alike.

### **The Situation**

Information, technology and communication processes with economics are the basics for modern knowledge society development. We are living in the era of digitalization which will surely cause changes to mankind on individual and social level. Though, we are still seeking to maintain development, social sensibility, eco consciousness, ethics and quality. The paradigms in modern economy and finance are on the brink to change (cf. Ross 2005): the major assumptions of neoclassical finance are obviously not consistent with the facts and figures characterising reality grasped by the data and methods available today. Two aspects need to be addressed: the one is the decision-making based on the rational man assumption and the other is the no arbitrage assumption. The first ignores the circumstances caused by the decision-making by individuals; the necessity to regard these behavioural aspects led to behavioural finance. The importance of behavioural/psychological aspects was already underlined by scholars like von Hayek a long time ago. Von Hayek's arguments, however, suffered from the absence of a formal treatment. The eschewal of formal tools also endangered the behavioural finance approach. Discrete choice models do offer a methodology to treat psychological aspects formally. The no arbitrage assumption ignores the existence of and the effects generated by markets: the major deficiencies might be characterised by the neoclassical procedure to search for arbitrage opportunities by methods that are grounded on the assumption that arbitrage opportunities do not exist. The importance of markets has been known long before the predominance of the neoclassical paradigm. The appropriate term has been catallactics – quite in use since the 1920s – and has been rediscovered by those dissatisfied with the shortcomings of the neoclassical theory. We apply the term catallactics, even if our call is meant to encourage particularly, but is not limited to, the submission of papers addressing both aspects with a combined methodology. The life on the Earth was and will be put under limits of mutual relationship, interaction, transaction and by creating networks. Co-orientation is helping us to bring more and more communication events in synchrony. If the synchrony increases in the narrower area within the shorter time pattern, it is likely to expect it will continue to expand into whole society. Information, communication, ICT (Information and Communication Technology) with economy and other technology and knowledge will be circularly connected, and globalization processes will accordingly influence their development. Possibly, it will not be like that? Does globalisation mean disappearance of the individuality or not? Does the globalisation intensify individual consciousness? How are globalization process related to knowledge society? What are the relations among information technology, networking and stakeholders? What is virtual knowledge? Who created the virtual knowledge - the interdisciplinary teams or «knowledge workers»? What are the positions of e-business, e-communication and e-knowledge in a networked world? What kind of influences does the digitalization make on social processes in the society? Is it possible that communication affairs synchrony creates the procedures and standards of symbolic global communication? What is going on



with the dynamics of education within distance learning, lifelong learning, management education and training, informal learning? How shall we navigate economy, information and communication complexity in the modern knowledge society? What is modern interactive agent-based modelling of dynamic market processes? How to do human learning and decision-making on markets? What is the emergent impact of market microstructure on market outcomes? Which are non-equilibrium asset pricing with evaluation of discrete activities, etc.?

At least **four issues** could be differentiated. They are of course intertwined:

Firstly, a more technological issue: Wrapping the huge amount of ICT data into XML based mark-up languages thus achieving the data processing speed required. Standardization is a necessary precondition. However standards are as good as far as they are accepted by the knowledge society. What is the relation to relevant ISO standards that are proposed too? Will there be a convergence to unique standards in the modern knowledge society? Secondly, a more regulatory issue: The regulatory bodies in the modern knowledge society have to provide rules and regulations that ascertain fair working and living. Various regulatory bodies have to fix the data and information (or knowledge) that is appropriate to determine the best working and living environment in the modern knowledge society. The evaluation could be refined when relying on the complete or incomplete set of data and information (or knowledge). The switch from the investigation of the data and information (or knowledge) to the investigation of the modern knowledge society models will provide more reliable picture about the modern knowledge society performance. Computerized and other artificially established rules enable best knowledge society environment surveillance. Computerized and other artificially established analytical models have the big advantage that the surveillance of the best working and living environment in the modern knowledge society has been possible quite reliably. It is an open question until now, which data and information (or knowledge) describing the real modern knowledge society situation has to be included in the model that is necessary to evaluate best practice. Recent remarks of the various regulatory bodies and practice indicate that the more data are implemented the more reliable the result seems to be. Thirdly, which data and information (or knowledge) should be exploited by models to make working and living environment in the modern knowledge society as sustainable as possible? Event data and information (or knowledge) relies on the causal structure of individual model events. The prevailing procedures in modelling the modern knowledge society environment seem to rely on pure statistical figures, mainly correlations, but they have to be extended into more reliable cause and effect structures. Fourthly, which data and information (or knowledge) structure gives an exchange a competitive edge to attract the best modelling practice in modelling the modern knowledge society environment? Those models which have the most advanced techniques both with regard to speed of data and information (or knowledge) processing and modern knowledge society environment matching will succeed.

### **The issues to be discussed**

Regarding these explanations, papers dealing with a broad range of topics related to the general issues sketched above are welcome. The following list is a guideline, but not exhaustive. Today, we are witnessing that companies' success is not measured only by profit. The following issues should be related as well: Information & Knowledge Management; Information Systems & Network Centric Concepts and Solutions; Decision Support Architecture & Information and System Assurance; Cyber Attacks & System Engineering Technologies; Security and Quality of Service Issues; Ontology and Taxonomy in Knowledge systems with Semantic Interoperability; Modeling and Simulation & Web Technology, Platforms and Portals; Hypertext, Hypermedia and Multimedia; Human factors & Resource Management; Technology Demonstration, Standards and Interoperability; Knowledge and Data Engineering; Data Sharing and Warehousing; Learning and Adaptation; Knowledge Discovery and Data Mining; Software re-engineering & Human-computer Interaction; Data and Knowledge Visualization; Navigating organizational complexity with communication and ICT managers; Tangible outcomes from managing intangibles; Dynamics of organizational change, business ethics and communication culture; Navigating organizational and social changes with developing human character; The influence of co-orientation, integration, transaction and interaction process within the organization on communication modalities; Shall globalization process not create information and



communication chaos in a networked world(?); The changing role of economy, information (ICT) and communications technology; What is the role of social communication structures in disseminating knowledge across various sections of society in order to enable its development into knowledge society? How far has an equal and universal access to knowledge been ensured to all sections of the contemporary society (in different countries, including Croatia)? What communication competences still need to be developed by different social segments (academic community, economic entities, and governmental bodies, civil society) in order to ensure smooth establishment of knowledge society? Which steps still need to be taken in national legal systems and governance in order to satisfy preconditions for the implementation of the European Communication Policy?

### Call for Papers

Papers that address any of the above listed issues are invited. Participants who wish to present a paper are requested to submit two copies of an Abstract (up to 200 words) as soon as possible, but not later than March 30, 2010. An abstract of approximately 200 words should be submitted for evaluation, and all proposals will be judged on the basis of their scholarly quality, originality and potential for further discourse. Notification of acceptance will be sent to authors by April 9, 2010. The full papers, not to exceed 5 single-spaced typed pages, should be submitted with photo-ready copies of artwork by May 9, 2010. All submitted papers will be refereed. Those selected will be scheduled for presentation and published in Conference Proceedings. ## INSTRUCTIONS TO AUTHORS

The following standard format has been developed to facilitate the publication of conference papers. Since it is intended to print the Conference Proceedings directly from the photo-ready manuscripts submitted by the authors, we request close compliance with the specifications below:

**LENGTH:** Papers should not exceed five pages printed with single spacing (including illustrations). A surcharge of Euros 45 will be charged to authors for each additional page exceeding the above limit.

**PAPER:** White letter size (8.5 in. x 11 in., North American format) paper of 20 lb. weight or more.

**MARGINS:** Single column text within left and right margins of 25 mm (1 in.) and top and bottom margins of 30 mm (1.25 in.).

**PAGE NUMBERING:** Pages should be numbered consecutively at the bottom center leaving a margin of 20 mm (0.75 in.).

**HEADINGS:** One level of section headings is preferred. Headings should be set in bold upper and lower case letters, two points larger than the text (not underlined).

**TEXT:** Text should be set in Times New Roman font with a size of 12 points.

**ILLUSTRATIONS:** Illustrations should be either black-on-white line drawings, or glossy black-and-white photographs with good contrast. Their horizontal dimension must not exceed the width of the text. All illustrations should be numbered, provided with a legend and referred to in the text.

**UNITS OF MEASUREMENT:** Standard International (SI) units should be used. The traditional foot-pound units may be added in parenthesis. Monetary data may be in any currency unit. However, authors are encouraged to add the equivalent amount in (US) \$ in parentheses to facilitate comparison.

**REFERENCES:** References in the text should be cited as follows:

- (i) (Howard, 1988); for one author
- (ii) (Peters and Niles, 1989); for two authors
- (iii) (Miller et al, 1983); for three or more authors

References should be listed at the end of the paper, arranged in alphabetical order by the first author's surname. If more than one publication by the same author in a particular year are cited they should be designated at 1986a, 1986b, and so on. The format of the reference list should be as follows:

- Howard, J.B. (1988); Artificial Intelligence Principles and Practice; Longman (pp. 53)
- Peters, P. B. and L. S. Niles (1989); Evaluation of Rate Algorithm; Artificial Intelligence Applications, Vol. 6, No. 2 (pp. 23-26)
- Miller, A., Penrose, D.F. and R.J. Ross (1983); The DIAZ Expert System: Design and Implementation; Proc. 3<sup>rd</sup> International Symposium on Cybernetics (ed. W. Fisher), Butterworth (pp. 359-368)

**FIRST PAGE:** The first page should include the full title of the paper, the name of the author(s) and their affiliation, an Abstract of approximately 200 words, and no more than six keywords to facilitate indexing.

7. I will respect the time of my presentation which is 10 (to 15) minutes for presentation (maximum) and 5 (to 10) minutes for questions – interaction with the audience (maximum).
8. No entrance in the conference room is allowed after the opening of the session and nobody can come out from the conference room until the end of the session.
9. I will not distribute any academic or commercial material in the conference without prior written approval of the organizing committee of the **9<sup>th</sup> ICESKS**.
10. My mobile phone will be inactivated in the conference room(s) as well as in the room of the secretariat.
11. I will have the usual academic/university behaviour avoiding speaking loudly or speaking with intense to my colleagues or even creating small or big problems to the organizers
12. I will not refuse to Chair any Session if the Organizing Committee will ask it from me.
13. **Presenters** must be in the conference room 20 minutes before the opening of their session in order to deliver their brief biography (printed out or written by hand very clearly) to the session chairman.  
**Session Chairmen** must be 20 minutes before the opening of their session at the conference room gathering the brief biographies of the presenters.

Please note that individuals using computer projection must bring a CD or USB memory key containing their presentation. Speakers should arrive in their session room 20 minutes before the start of their session to hand the presenter's personal data sheet (biography) to the chairperson.

## **General Considerations**

- Limit the number of words per visual to no more than 30.
- Leave space, at least the height of a capital letter, between lines of text.
- All fonts, including those on graphs, should be 18 point or larger.
- Graphs and charts should have bold lines and symbols that contrast sharply with the background.
- Your presentation time is about 10 to 15 minutes, leaving about 5 to 10 minutes for questions from the audience.
- A reasonable presentation time for each slide is about 2 minutes, as any shorter interval will make it difficult for the audience to understand.
- Do not waste visuals where they are not needed. Use them where a picture, chart, diagram, or cartoon will help. Tables of figures are hard to read and understand quickly, use pie charts or column graphs instead.
- If it takes longer than 10 seconds to comprehend a visual, then there's too much material in it. Do not put anything on the visual if you don't need it. Tell what each visual is all about, but do not read from it. Keep it on screen, as long as your talk refers to it.

## **General Information**

Please check the session schedule on the program that you will receive by email after the registration deadline to see which day and time you are presenting. The duration of a presentation slot is 15 to 25 minutes (10 to 15 minutes for your lecture and 5 to 10 minutes for questions-discussion). An LCD projector and a computer (MS Windows XP or Vista) with a CD-ROM drive, USB ports, and presentation software (MS PowerPoint, Adobe Acrobat Reader) will be available in all the conference rooms for lecture presentations.

Also, a Laser Pointer will be available for you, but it is highly recommended to have your own pointer in case of emergencies.



## TERMS

1. Candidate authors in the **9<sup>th</sup> ICESKS Symposium** at InterSymp-2010 Conference must submit only **original research work**, never published elsewhere and not submitted simultaneously to any other forum (including other conferences or journals).
2. Overview papers are not published, except very special cases of world distinguished personalities and only after invitation by the **9<sup>th</sup> ICESKS Symposium** at InterSymp-2010 Conference.
3. After delivering (uploading) the paper, authors receive an Identification Number (**ID**) for their paper(s). Authors must save this important ID number or write it somewhere.
4. All the papers are reviewed by two or three independent reviewers.
5. A paper withdrawn is permitted **at least 30 days before the opening of the conference. To avoid withdrawals from non-authorized person, you have to apply by FAX to the FAX number that the organizers will hint.** None paper's withdrawn is permitted in the last 30 days before the conference. After the withdrawal of your paper (must be sent **ONLY by FAX**), you receive by email an ID Code of your withdrawal. This is a confirmation of your withdrawal and the authors must make registration for the conference after this period.
6. By delivering (uploading) the paper, the author authorizes the **9<sup>th</sup> ICESKS Symposium** at InterSymp-2010 Conference to publish the paper and transfer to **ICESKS** the copyright. You have been accepted to receive the **ICESKS Newsletter** (mailing list).
7. Authors are responsible for the printing quality of their papers. Authors must not use national fonts in their papers, because in some computers these fonts are not recognized. All the fonts must be Times New Roman. National fonts (Croatian for example) are not permitted. If you want to use Greek letters in mathematical relationships, use the Equation Editor (MS Word Users) or as mathematical symbols (only LaTeX users). Images must be embedded in the documents. the **9<sup>th</sup> ICESKS Symposium** at InterSymp-2010 Conference **will not be responsible for possible errors of authors of this type.**
8. The **9<sup>th</sup> ICESKS Symposium** at InterSymp-2010 Conference will produce the contents of the proceedings and the program using the information that the authors will send when filling in the web **Submission Form**. Possible errors by the authors might be transferred in the proceedings and the program. Authors must be extremely careful when filling in the Submission Form.

9. For each paper, at least one author **must be registered** (visit the Hyperlink: "Registration Fees" in the web page of the conference) as well as at least one author **must show up** in the conference to present the paper.
10. The **9<sup>th</sup> ICESKS Symposium** at InterSymp-2010 Conference will keep and will be able to provide copies of the proceedings for authors that did not show up in the conference for 60 days after the conference. The extra fee is 100 EUR for mailing expenses by secure and registered post. If this extra fee is paid after the conference, **ICESKS** is obliged to send the proceedings by secure and registered (safe) mail that will be delivered to the authors' hand-by-hand. After this time interval, i.e. 60 days after the last day of the particular conference, **ICESKS** is not obliged to maintain copies for the authors that did not come to the particular conference.
11. The **9<sup>th</sup> ICESKS Symposium** at InterSymp-2010 Conference does not accept papers' presentation with Overhead Projector any longer.  
(The reason are : (i) Less than 1% uses Overhead projector, (ii) Sometimes, especially the hand-written transparencies have bad quality (iii) The hotels and Conference Centres do not use overhead projectors any longer (iv) Valuable time is lost in a session changing from Data Projector to Overhead Projector and vice versa)  
**ICESKS** accepts now presentations **only**:
  - \* **Power Point**
  - \* **PDF (Acrobat Reader)**
  - \* **DOC (Simple Word)**
  - \* **HTML (as web pages)**
12. **ICESKS** strongly discourages changes in the final program. On the other hand, unavoidable changes in the final program due to the absence of authors **do not charge the ICESKS**. For these non-shows up of a percentage of some presenters, the **9<sup>th</sup> ICESKS Symposium** at InterSymp-2010 Conference declares: **not** responsible.
13. The present terms can be found in: page before "Terms" and are uniform for the entire **9<sup>th</sup> ICESKS Symposium** at InterSymp-2010 Conference. Authors are encouraged to print out this page or to save it in their computers.



The mandatory part of the **ICESKS** registration fees includes:

a) Publication of your paper in the Book of the Proceedings (Hard Copy) with ISBN number as Proceedings (or/and ISSN Number as International Book series). A copy of the Book of the Proceedings will be given to you during the conference. In case of multiple volumes, the author receives the hard-copy of the volumes where his paper(s) has/have been published.

possible b) Publication of your paper in the CD-ROM Proceedings, only on your special request, containing the Proceedings of all the **ICESKS Symposiums** at InterSymp International Conferences that will be held in parallel in the same place. A copy of this CD-ROM, containing the Proceedings of all the joint international conferences will be given to you during the conference, and **according to special agreement**.

possible c) Publication of your paper in the ICESKS on-line e-library <http://www.ecnsi.hr/en/>, **only on your special request**. A username and a password will be given to you with full access to all the **ICESKS Symposiums** at InterSymp Conference Proceedings (since 2003) immediately after your registration, and **according to special agreement**.

possible: d) JOURNAL PUBLICATION: The authors of the best papers will be invited to send extended versions of their papers to various international reputable journals, **ICESKS Transactions** included. However, these papers must be of high-quality (break-through work) and a new round of a very strict review will follow. No additional fee will be required for the publication of the extended version in a journal.

**Note that only papers that will be presented by an author in the conference could be considered for possible journal publication.**

The main registration includes also rich coffee-breaks.

**Student Registration:** 345 EUR. Student Registration included conference material, access to all sessions, and coffee-breaks. Sometimes student registration cannot be applied to students that present paper(s) in the conference. Sometimes student registration only includes proceedings, and coffee-breaks, but cannot justify publication of the paper in the proceedings neither presentation of a paper. Rate is for an attendee only. Only for finished Ph.D. students it is not the rule. Usually other students may present the paper *as long as the full author registration fee has been paid by a co-author.*
